Entry requirements

Bachelor degree with a major in Political Science, or equivalent.

The forms of assessment of student performance

The course is examined by individual oral and written seminar tasks, compilation of contract, and written project PM.

Course contents

The course module include the following integrated main components:

- 1. Seminar series including: background, evolvement, development of Work Integrated Learning (WIL) related to theories, pedagogics, and application within social sciences.
 - Introduction: different views on WIL and related concepts from different settings, and how these are applied in different practices and contexts.

- Theoretical perspectives of knowledge learning WIL.
- Description, illustration and discussion of how WIL research can be related to (contextualised) in political science/political studies.
- Perspectives of WIL theories and methods can be applied in political science/political studies. To fill the space/gap between theoretical and practical knowledge, with the capacity to shift between, and integrate, different (normative, empirical) perspectives of knowledge creation. To critically be able to formulate processes where new knowledge is produced, and used, through WIL.
- 2. Workshop series focusing on skills and abilities
 - Positionality: who is a social scientist/political analyst? Perspective/identification of nationality, gender, race, language etc in work- and research contexts.
 - Problem-identification and planning using a logical framework process, including: aim/objectives, strategies, stakeholders, outputs, M&E etc.
 - Ethics and professionalism: in workplace, in research, in positionality
 - Communication and networking in workplace, in research.
- 3. Developing a three-party contract (MOU) between student university (supervisor) host organisation
 - Identification and planning of research studies to be conducted with a host organisation, through the application of a logical framework process. Baseline TORs to be identified
 - Identification of suitable WIL-approach (theory & method)
 - Planning of research task(s) in time and space.
 - Establishment and decision of the three-party contract.
