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## Reflection of the stages of thesis writing

Stages of thesis writing, including four written assignment, peer-feedback and discussed in the seminars, including a formative and summative assessment by supervisor

- literature review -> research question
- theoretical -> analytical framework
- problem identification -> problem tree and objectives tree
- results -> analysis
