Entry requirements

The forms of assessment of student performance

The course is examined by individual oral and written seminar tasks, compilation of contract, and written project PM.

Course contents

The course module - WIL Reflection & Portfolio II - is conducted in connection to the second part of the research work internship placement and thereto connected thesis writing. The course module is also closely linked to WIL Reflection & Portfolio I.

COURSE SYLLABUS



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The course module is conducted in form of a seminar series, with 4 monthly full-day on-line/campus seminars, including the following integrated main components:

Reflection on the theory of WIL

Theory of WIL, with four seminars structured around both (i) reflection on WIL knowledge and (ii) capabilities and (iii) link to thesis

- Themes = positionality, problem—identification, ethics and networking
- Students to journal on each theme as they go (use for workshops) and submit a final CV/portfolio

Other regulations
