Learning outcomes

Upon completing the course, students should be able to:

- describe the UN Declaration of the Rights of the Child and provide examples of how children's and young people's right to be heard and to participate in decisions that affect them is taken into account in child and youth related activities such as leisure time, schools, healthcare centres, social services and the court system,
- propose and argue for change that will enhance children's and young people's right to be heard and to participate in decisions that affect them and their freedom to take part in child and youth related activities,
- exemplify and explain how children's and young people's right to be heard and participate in decisions that affect them is protected on a national and international level.

Entry requirements

BA/BSc in education or nursing, 180 credits, or Bachelor's degree, 180 credits with a major in social work and social pedagogy, psychology, pedagogics, sociology, culture studies or public health or the equivalent, and the equivalent of English studies at the upper secondary (high school) level in Sweden, called English 6 or English B.
