Learning outcomes

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- give examples of different kinds of research reviews and how they are used as a basis for shaping policy, practice, and further research,
- discuss the opportunities and limitations associated with the principle of evidence-based practice, especially in working with children and adolescents,
- systematically search for literature in relevant databases, and critically examine the scientific credibility of various/different sources of information,
- analyse and structure complex written material and thereby answering a scientific research question,
- independently account for the state of knowledge within a defined field in Child and Youth studies and thereby identify and discuss different theoretical and methodological perspectives.

Entry requirements

BA/BSc in education or nursing, 180 credits, or Bachelor's degree, 180 credits with a major in social work and social pedagogy, psychology, pedagogics, sociology, culture studies or public health or the equivalent, and the equivalent of English studies at the upper secondary (high school) level in Sweden, called English 6 or English B.

The forms of assessment of student performance

Assessment of students' performance will be in the form of a written and an oral presentation of an individually composed assignment.
