- demonstrate accuracy and precision in terms of text processing and academic formalities

- identify, formulate and scientifically study a relevant economic problem firmly rooted in prior research
- explain and state the reasons for the choice of research approach, using arguments based on the philosophy of science and research methodology
- search for literature and review the current relevant theoretical and empirical work related to the selected problem
- apply the relevant scientific methodology on the selected topic/problem and conduct an independent and critical analysis
- interpret the results and refer to the previous findings in the field
- demonstrate and argue for the results' and the model's usefulness
- write with scientific accuracy based on established requirements for language and format
- orally present, discuss and defend their thesis in publicly held seminars

Judgment and evaluation

- critically review, evaluate the own and others degree projects and other research studies with a high degree of scientific awareness
- critically discuss relevant scientific, social and ethical aspects which influence research and investigations in the economic field

The forms of assessment of student performance

The students carry out a scientific study, a thesis work, individually or in groups of no more than two students. The course is assessed through the following elements: writing and submission of the thesis the defense of their own thesis at a public seminar opposition to another thesis at a public seminar active participation in compulsory seminars The work must be submitted in digital form (MSWord or PDF) for the assessment of performance. Upon successful completion of the course work will be archived in DiVA. Detailed instructions, grading criteria, and the timetable for all assessment elements for regular examination and re-examination will be presented in the course-PM at the course start. Course contents

The course is conducted in the form of seminars and consists of planning, implementation, presentation and defense of a major study, and also a critical review of other projects. The process of planning and implementation is performed in seminars based on critical review, discussions, and suggestions for improvement and further development. Presentations are performed in speech and in writing.
